

## SCHOOL CLOSING GUIDELINES

Although severe weather conditions are the most common reason for a change of school schedule, other events such as a utility outage could necessitate the cancellation or early dismissal of school. The overriding concern in making the decision to close schools is the safety of our students, staff, and others in the community. The fundamental decision is whether students will be safer with school in session or with school closed for the day. Several factors are considered, including the following: Road conditions throughout the 161 square miles that make up our district; Wind chill, especially if combined with poor roads due to heavy snow or ice, creates the possibility of buses running late and students having to wait longer outdoors; Finally, the forecasted conditions throughout the day. When severe winter weather occurs, the following steps are taken to examine weather conditions and to decide whether to close schools: The Superintendent, Maintenance Supervisor and Transportation Director consult to assess road conditions; The district reviews weather forecast models from the National Weather Service, The Weather Channel and AccuWeather; The district may also consult with neighboring districts and the Washburn County Sheriff’s Department. The decision to cancel school for the day will be made by 6:00 AM. The School Closing Guidelines can be found on the District’s Website under *School & Community Resources*.

## OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR IS FEBRUARY 5 - APRIL 30, 2024

**What is Open Enrollment?** The inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend public school in a school district other than the one in which they reside.

**Who can apply?** Any Wisconsin resident in 4K to grade 12 may apply to attend a nonresident school district under the open enrollment program. However, a child may transfer to a nonresident school district for early childhood education or 4K only if the child’s resident school district offers the same type of program and only if the child is eligible for that program in the resident school district.

**When can parents apply?** The regular open enrollment application period for the 2024-25 school year begins on 2/5/24 and ends at 4:00 pm on 4/30/24. ### SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH

This year, the District has partnered with Anchor Bay Counseling in Spooner through a federal grant to provide school-based mental health services. Counseling services are provided to students two days per week with referrals made through the school counseling department.

Through counseling, students are able to gain a better understanding of their thoughts, feelings and behaviors while working to develop strategies to make positive changes in their lives. Staff have seen the benefits of having therapists on-site to meet students where they are at while removing insurance and transportation barriers.

As part of the school-based mental health grant, interested staff will be trained in Youth Mental Health First Aid. This course will provide staff with a better understanding of common mental health challenges that youth are currently facing and how to respond. The District looks forward to continuing to utilize the grant funds to best support our students’ needs.

**Shell Lake School Board** meetings are held on the 3rd Monday of the month at 6:00 PM. 

## ACADEMIC & CAREER PLANNING

The Shell Lake High School Counseling Department is working on Academic & Career Planning (ACP). ACP is a student-driven, adult supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique and information-based visions for post-secondary success, obtained through self-exploration, career exploration and the development of career management and planning skills. Students in 8-12th grade participate in ACP lessons. During these lessons students learn about the 16 career clusters, explore areas of interest pertaining to future planning, explore the Student Course Book to assist in course planning, and be guided through the ACP Student Plan. This year's goal is to create the foundation for ACP, and continue to build upon this year after year. This process is crucial for making informed decisions and maximizing opportunities for students' success.
