

This app will enable parents, students and teachers to make healthy food choices whenever it's convenient. Parents can access this service by going to either the iTunes App Store or Google Play and downloading the app to their device. You can also get the same information by visiting the School District website or <u>www.MySchoolMenus.com</u>. There, you can easily print nutrition information and district menus for posting at home. The School Nutrition Department is excited to offer parents and students this new nutrition resource!

This year we are bringing the community a Super Snack instead of the After School Snack as we have offered in recent years. The meal will operate similarly to our summer meals - free to anyone 18 and under. The meal will be offered starting October 2019. In this meal, students will be given an opportunity to fill their body with nutrition that will hold them until dinner. Super Snack will be served as a quick service type meal, with the goal of allowing the students to consume their chosen items quickly. Student will be able to choose an entree item, grain and meat/meat alternate, fruit and/or vegetable and milk. We ask that those who chose to participate in this wonderful opportunity take at a minimum 3 of the 5 items offered. To make a complete meal participants must have a fruit or vegetable upon exiting our serving line.

Let's choose to be healthy through eating well, living with a sense of adventure and more time away from screens. Thank you for your support of School Nutrition and be sure to keep a look out for news and updates throughout the year via the school website. Annual Notices

Education Of Homeless Children And Youth

The school district's designated liaison for homeless children and youth is expected to ensure that public notice of educational rights of homeless children and youths is disseminated where such children and youths receive services such as the schools and family shelters. Homeless children and youth must have equal access to the same free, appropriate public education as provided to other children residing in the district and be provided with comparable services. Homeless children and youth cannot be required to attend a separate school or program for homeless children and must not be stigmatized by school personnel. Districts are also required to inform school personnel, service providers, advocates working with homeless families, the parents or guardians of homeless children and youth, and homeless children and youths of duties of the local liaison for homeless children and youth. Schools have additional obligations to communicate specific information to parents and guardians of homeless children and youth, and unaccompanied youth as they are identified.

Notice Of Child Find Activity

The school district must locate, identify, and evaluate all children with disabilities, including children with disabilities attending private schools in the school district, regardless of the severity of their disabilities. The school district has a special education screening program to locate and screen all children with suspected disabilities who have not graduated from high school. Upon request the school district will screen a child who has not graduated high school to determine whether a special education referral is appropriate. Annually the district conducts developmental screening of preschool children. A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to report the child to the school district in which the child resides. If the child attends a private school in another school district, the child should be reported to the school district where the child attends school. The school district maintains pupil records, including information from screening and special education referral. All records directly related to a student and maintained by the school district are pupil records.

They include records maintained in any way including, but not limited to, computer storage media, video and audiotape, film, microfilm, and microfiche. Records maintained for personal use by a teacher and not available to others and records available only to persons involved in the psychological treatment of a child are not pupil records. The school district maintains several classes of pupil records. This includes progress records, behavioral records, directory data and pupil physical health records.

Notice of Suicide Prevention Resources

The Board of Education recognizes that suicide is a major mental health and social problem in contemporary America and has become particularly acute for youth. The Board further accepts the principle that youth suicide is preventable and that educating the public is a critical element in that prevention effort. The school district suicide prevention, intervention and aftercare programs are shared services with the community that necessitate coordination between public and private agencies. The Board supports school-based programs to prevent suicide among youth. These programs, under the direction of the guidance department, will include: (1) training, (2) suicide prevention curriculum, (3) intervention plan, and (4) aftercare program.

Students Records

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and section 118.125, Wisconsin Statutes, afford parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") the following rights with respect to education records:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of receipt of the request.
- The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate or misleading.
- The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information in the student's education records, except to the extent that federal and state law authorize disclosure without consent.

Student Bullying

The School District of Shell Lake strives to provide a safe, secure and respectful learning environment for all students in school buildings, on school grounds, on school buses and at school=sponsored activities. The school district consistently and vigorously addresses bullying so that there is no disruption to the learning environment and learning process. Bullying is deliberate or intentional behavior using words or actions, intended to cause fear, intimidation or harm. The behavior may be motivated by an actual or perceived distinguishing characteristic, such as, but not limited to: age; national origin; race; ethnicity; religion; gender; gender identity; sexual orientation; physical attributes; physical or mental ability or disability; and social, economic or family status. Bullying behavior is prohibited in all schools, buildings, property and educational environments, including any property or vehicle owned, leased or used by the school district. This includes public transportation regularly used by students to go to and from school. Educational environments include, but are not limited to, every activity under school supervision. All school staff members and school officials who observe or become aware of acts of bullying are required to report these acts to the appropriate building principal. Any other person, including a student who is either a victim of the bullying or is aware of the bullying or any other concerned individual is encouraged to report the conduct to the counselor or principal. Reports of bullying may be made verbally or in writing and may be made confidentially. All such reports, whether verbal or in writing, will be taken seriously and a clear account of the incident must be documented. The recipient of the report will make a written record of the report, including all pertinent details. The school official receiving a report of bullying shall immediately notify the school district employee assigned to investigate the report.

The person assigned by the district to conduct an investigation of the bullying report shall, within one school day, interview the person(s) who are the victim(s) of the bullying and collect whatever other information is necessary to determine the facts and the seriousness of the report.

Parents and/or guardians of each pupil involved in the bullying will be notified prior to the conclusion of the investigation. The district shall maintain the confidentiality of the report and any related pupil records to the extent required by law. If it is determined that students participated in bullying behavior or retaliated against anyone due to the reporting of bullying behavior, the school district administration and school board may take disciplinary action, including: suspension, expulsion and/or referral to law enforcement officials for possible legal action as appropriate. Pupil services staff will provide support for the identified victim(s). The school district will also provide a copy of the policy to any person who requests it.

Parent Notification regarding "Highly Qualified" Status of Teacher

The federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB) requires schools to notify parents or legal guardians when their child has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not considered "highly qualified." In Wisconsin, a teacher of a core academic subject is "highly qualified" if he or she completed an approved educator preparation program resulting in a regular license to teach that subject. In some cases, we have had to fill teaching assignments in core academic subjects with teachers on emergency licenses or permits when licensed teachers were not available to hire. As required by federal law, the School District of Shell Lake is taking action to ensure the highly qualified provision is met. Student Privacy

The Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA)(20 U.S.C., 1232h, 34 CFR Part 98) applies to programs that will receive funding from the U.W. Programs for English Language Learners

A bilingual-bicultural program is available to every identified student with a limited English proficiency. Parents/guardians of students with limited English proficiency must be notified no later than 30 days after the beginning of school of the following: (1) why the child was placed in the program; (2) the child's level of English proficiency; (3) the methods of instruction in the program in which their child is placed and those of other available programs; (4) how the program will meet the educational needs of their child; (5) how the program will specifically help learn English and meet age-appropriate academic achievement standards for grade promotion and graduation, (6) the specific exit requirements for the program; (7) in the case of a child with a disability, how the program meets the child's IEP objectives; and (8) information about parents rights. For a student not identified as limited English proficient prior to the beginning of the school year, the district must notify parents within the first two weeks of the child being placed in such a program.

Public Notice of Nondiscrimination

It is the policy of the Shell Lake School District that no person may be denied admission to any public school in this district or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil service, recreational or other program or activity because of the person's sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability or handicap as required by s. This policy also prohibits 118.13 WI Statutes. discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race and national origin), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. The district encourages informal resolution of complaints under this policy. A formal complaint resolution procedure is available to address allegations of violations of the policy in the Shell Lake School District. A form may be obtained at the School District Office.

Recruiter Access to Students/Records

A secondary school student or the parent(s)/guardian(s) of the student may request that the student's name, address and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters or institutions of higher education without prior written parental consent. Unless access to such information has been restricted by the secondary school student or the student's parent(s)/guardian(s) as outlined above, the District shall provide access to secondary school students' names, addresses and telephone listings, on request made by military recruiters or institutions of higher education. The District shall provide military recruiters the same access to secondary school students as provided generally to post-secondary educational institutions or to prospective employers of those students.

Schoolwide Title 1 District Parent and Family Involvement

The Shell Lake School District understands that involving families and gaining their support as full partners in the education of their children, makes those children more successful in school. This policy is written to ensure that parents of the children being served in the Title 1 program have had and will continue to have an adequate opportunity to participate in the design and implementation of the Shell Lake School District's Title 1 Program. Parents of students in the Title I program may request and obtain information from the building principal regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teachers, including the following: whether the teacher has met state licensing criteria for the grade level(s) and subject area(s) taught; whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency or provisional status through which state licensing criteria have been waived; and the undergraduate degree major of the teacher, and any graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, including the field of study of the certification or degree The professional qualifications of paraprofessionals providing services to their child. Notice of Special Needs Scholarship Program

This notice serves to inform parents and guardians of students with disabilities that the State of Wisconsin has established the Special Needs Scholarship Program. Under this scholarship program and as further specified in state law, a child with a disability who has been denied the opportunity to attend a nonresident school district under the full-time open enrollment program may be eligible to receive a scholarship from the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) that allows the child to attend an eligible private school that is participating in the Special Needs Scholarship Program. A parent or guardian who is interested in the Special Needs Scholarship Program should independently verify the participating private schools and the specific terms, eligibility criteria, and application procedures of the scholarship program with the DPI. The Special Needs Scholarship Program is further defined under section 115.7915 of the state statutes. However, special eligibility requirements not found in that statute exist for program scholarships that are awarded for private school attendance that initially began in the 2016-17 school year. Early College Credit Program

The Early College Credit Program provides eligible students an opportunity to take courses at technical colleges and institutions of higher education while in high school. Students interested in participating shall inform the district of their intentions to take post secondary courses under this program, prior to enrollment in the course(s) and within designated timelines.

This notice meets the requirements of Wisconsin Statute 118.55(8) to provide information about the Early College Credit Program to all students enrolled in grades 9, 10, and 11 in the school district.
