Shell Lake FFA Explores the Future of Farming at Fair Oaks Farms. They had the opportunity to experience the cutting edge of modern agriculture during their recent visit to Fair Oaks Farms. The trip was filled with exciting hands-on learning, including a close look at the farm's robotics and hog facilities.

The tour kicked off with a visit to the state-of-the-art robotic milking system, where students saw firsthand how technology is transforming traditional farming practices. LEARN MORE -

Shall the School Board of the School District of Shell Lake be authorized to exceed the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes beginning with the 2025-26 school year through the 2028-29 school year on a non-recurring basis by the following amounts for the purpose of paying expenses related to ongoing operational costs to include maintaining educational programming, educational resources, staffing and maintenance needs as follows: \$650,000 for the 2025-26 school year, \$935,000 for the 2026-27 school year, \$1,200,000 for the 2027-28 school year and \$1,475,000 for the 2028-29 school year as provided in the foregoing resolution?
